Reading updates

We are continuing to use our reading logs to record our reading and reflections. These are collected on a Thursday and we love to see what the children have been reading and their reflections.

PE

We will be participating in PE on Thursdays and Fridays each week this term.

Your child will need to bring in PE kit every on these days. They should continue to come in their school uniform and we will subsequently change into and out of our PE kit during the school day.

Our lessons will be based on net and ball game skills and athletics later in the term. Therefore, children will need to ensure they are bringing in sensible kit for PE which will largely be outside.

PE kit should include:

- A pair of trainers
- A pair of black shorts
- PE t-shirt
- PE sweater
- A pair of PE bottoms (for days where the sun is not shining)
- Ear tape for pierced ears if required

Curriculum Learning

We wanted to write to tell you some of the information about what your children will be learning in school this term. For our Humanities learning we are looking at 'Sow, Grow and Farm', This project teaches children about the features and characteristics of land use in agricultural regions across the world, including a detailed exploration of significant environmental areas.

In PHSEE we will be looking at 'How the Media Influences Us' and looking at topics like fake news, film classification and the use of social media, In BRAVE we will be focused on the question, 'What is Holiness in the Jewish Faith' In FRENCH we will be exploring 'Verbs in a French Week' where the children will be learning to read new verbs aloud with confidence and mostly accurate pronunciation. This half term's computing topic is 'Micro bits' which will involve us tinkering and programming Micro bits!

We will be reading Goodnight Mr Tom. All about a boy called William who is evacuated to live with Tom Oakley during WW2. It is a fantastic read and I am very much looking forward to reading it again with the children.

In Maths will be looking at Statistics, Shape and Position and Direction alongside consolidating our existing learning.

A final note...

For our Year 6s we will be commencing our SATs National testing during the week beginning 13th May 2024. We have been working hard with the children to develop their confidence and familiarity with the test and their subjects but, as always, we will continually reiterate the message that we only ask they try their best. An early morning breakfast will be provided for our year 6s during that week and we will give specific details of this closer to the time; just mentioning it now as we know this is a clear favourite of the week!
