SCHOOL MEAL REMINDER

The cost of a school meal in Years 3 to 6 is ± 2.30 (a week is ± 11.50 .) **School meals MUST be paid for in advance**. Payment is required online where a minimum of five meals must be purchased at any one time. The cost of the first half of the Autumn term is ± 80.50 .
