PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL SITE

We are sending this message to remind parents and carers of the importance of driving and parking safely around the school site. It is vital due care and attention for our school, our neighbours and other drivers is given.

We know it is very challenging to park around our school site but none of us want a child attending our setting to be a road traffic accident statistic! This week we have received worrying reports of near misses! This includes a report of two young children who had left the school site with an authorised older sibling and ran across the road, causing a car to break urgently to avoid hitting them! Additionally, the parking on several occasions this week would have prevented emergency services accessing our site and this is not acceptable.

We do have agreements with the village hall as well as The Rose and Crown to use their parking so please use these facilities and take the short walk to and from the school site.

We are seeking support from Suffolk Constabulary as well as Suffolk Highways regarding this matter, in the meantime please, please have due care and attention when dropping off and collecting your child/ren.

As is always the case, every effort will be made to keep the school open in severe weather. The school would only close if it is not safe for staff and pupils to travel to / from school and/or be on site.

There was much concern this morning with the heavy rain overnight and localised flooding in our locality.
