SUMMER TERM 1 ~ SCHOOL MEALS

For pupils in Years 3 to 6 (Oak Class and Hawthorn Class) the cost of a school meal is £2.60 per day. This half-term will cost £78.00 in total, (a week of school meals is £13.00.) Children can alternate between packed lunches and school meals as preferred but school meals need to be paid for in advance. Here is the link:

SWIMMING

Our youngest children across both our schools will start their swimming sessions from Monday 22nd April in our outdoor, heated swimming pool to develop their water safety and water confidence. The children will need their swimming kits on the Tuesday of that week. The children will need:

- A ONE PIECE swimming costume or pair of swimming shorts / trunks
- a towel
- a swimming hat

Suitable footwear to walk from the classroom to the pool, (e.g. flip flops / water shoes / crocs,) otherwise they will be wearing their school shoes.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ~ ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

With the current economic climate and continuing rises in costs to living, we wanted to remind families about accessing free school meals.

We strongly urge you to check, especially if your circumstances have changed or change unexpectedly and remember they are not just available if you are unemployed. The process is completely confidential and pupils entitled to and claiming free school meals are not identified in any way.

In addition, the number of pupils registered will positively impact on school funding; in these tricky financial times this will provide much needed extra financial support to the school so please check and register, whether or not your child wishes to eat a school meal regularly.

FREE School MEALS



Free School Meals could save you up to £450 a year

What's more, if you sign up, your child's school receives extra funding from the Government, up to £1,455 a year. Even if your child is getting Universal Infant Free School Meals in Key Stage 1, your school will still benefit if you are entitled.

Applying online only takes a few minutes and, if eligible, you will receive free meals until March 2025. Visit: www.suffolk.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals.

To get free school meals you need to be receiving one of the following:

- Universal Credit (up to £7,400 net earned income)
- Income Support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support allowance
- Working Tax Credit run on
- Child Tax Credit but no element of Working Tax Credit and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190
