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Governors' Newsletter, Autumn Term 2023.

Welcome to the first newsletter of the Federation Governing Board! We hope to provide our families and friends with a termly update on the work we undertake to support the Federation community and particularly, the learning and well-being of all our children.

With the exception of the two staff governors, we are all unpaid volunteers. Every governor undertakes the role to make a difference to the lives of the children at the two schools. At the moment, we have eleven governors bringing a wide range of experience and different skill sets to the Board. Have a look at the Federation website to find out a little more about us! We currently have just two vacancies on the Board and would particularly welcome a member of the Thurlow local community where we are underrepresented.

This term, we have had two meetings of the full Governing Board and our two committees (Finance and Personnel; Premises, Health Safety and Welfare) have also met. A panel of governors held the performance review of the Executive Headteacher, just one of our many important responsibilities. Individual governors have undertaken a number of visits. For example, Rev'd Giles met with Lizzie Allin, our new leader of the Beliefs, Religions and Values Education (BRAVE). The Vice-Chair, Sue McKeogh, met with Emily Budinger to find out more about the current provision for children identified with SEND. Laura Masters-Stonehouse is our safeguarding governor and met with office staff to ensure that records of staff safeguarding checks are fully up to date. As Chair, I have met regularly with the Executive Headteacher; our discussions are always wide-ranging and this term we have talked about everything from asbestos to the reading curriculum! Governors have attended events at the schools, including celebration assemblies and the Nativity performances. Several of us also thoroughly enjoyed joining the children for their Christmas lunch!

We have held one 'face to face' full Governing Board meeting and one 'remote' meeting this term. Having online meetings during the winter makes participation much easier for those governors who live further afield. Discussions in our meetings are always very wide-ranging and have included approving new and updated policies, Federation finances and the new Federation Development and Improvement Plan. We have received reports from the two committees and from individual governors with specific responsibilities such as safeguarding. We have also had a very informative briefing from the teacher who leads on the Federation provision for Relationships, Sex and Health Education. It is an important part of our role to have a good understanding of curriculum provision. We undertake training both as individual governors and as a Board. This term, the Board updated their safeguarding training. There was an important emphasis on ensuring children keep safe online and as a result, we have asked a governor to oversee the Federation's 'monitoring and tracking' of the children's online safety.

If you have a child in KS2, you have probably heard about the Governors' Telescope Competition! The telescope was donated to the Federation and we do hope you will encourage your child/ren to take part in the competition. We'll be announcing the winner during January.

AS BEFORE: SUPERVISION OF CHILDREN

We continue to be very concerned at further reports received regarding the behaviour of a small number of children, likely to be under 10, in and around the village, unsupervised.

We have received further worrying reports of <u>children with vapes</u> as well as behaving inappropriately at the park and village shop. This is in addition to the recently highlighted concerns about young girls and boys, cycling and scootering unsafely on the roads and pavements, putting themselves, pedestrians and drivers at risk.

We are compelled to share this with you; we are very concerned about this, not least the safety of these children as well as the possible trouble they could find themselves in with the police for anti-social behaviour or worse.

AS BEFORE: URGENT: START OF THE SCHOOL DAY

It has been brought to our attention that we have a **number of children** being **dropped off outside the school** and **left unsupervised** first thing in the morning. <u>This is before the start of the school day</u>. Please note children **remain the responsibility of their parent/carer <u>until</u>** they are 'handed over' to their Class Teacher at **8.45am** when **the school day begins** and <u>not before</u>.

Children must not be left without a supervising adult. Parents/carers are responsible for anything that goes wrong in their absence. <u>It is an offence to leave a child alone if it places them at risk.</u>

As a school, we recognise and sympathise with the often-complex pressures faced by families in balancing work and childcare. It is why we offer childcare provision first thing in the mornings from 8am for the nominal cost of £2.00 per session within our Morning Sports Club run by qualified staff from Prestige Sports. We urge parents/carers to make use of this facility and book sessions to support childcare needs with Mrs Mitson in our School Office.

Additionally, we also recognise the challenges of parking around our school site so we politely ask parents to consider their child's safety and welfare ~ arrive a few minutes early, park a little further away and walk your child into school. Stay with them and set them up to have the best day!
