SCARLET FEVER REMINDER

As the week draws to a close I just wanted to remind everyone that we have a very small number of confirmed cases of scarlet fever within the school. As mentioned in our recent letter whilst it is usually a mild illness, it should be treated with antibiotics to minimise the risk of complications and reduce the spread to others. It is a reportable illness and we are in regular communication with our local Health Protection Team.

We are also undertaking additional 'deep' cleaning at school, reminding the children about handwashing through the day, especially after visiting the toilet and the disposing of tissues / covering their mouths when sneezing.

Please keep an eye out for early symptoms such as sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting as well as a red, pinhead rash that typically appears on the chest / tummy and gives the skin a sandpaper-like texture.

If you think you or your child have scarlet fever please seek a diagnosis from your GP urgently, not least so you can access the full course of prescribed antibiotics necessary to clear this contagious infection.

UNITY SCHOOLS PARTNERSHIP TWO-WEEK HALF TERM

Unity are again asking parents and staff about their opinions on the half-term break in 2024 and future years.

We remain unconvinced that a shorter lunch and/or break-time and an extra 5 minutes onto the school day across an academic year equates to a week's worth of learning.

We have shared our views and concerns with **Tim Coulson**, **Unity's Chief Executive**, highlighting the **negative impact on pupils, families and staff**. <u>We do not believe the benefits of the 'pilot' outweigh the children's loss of learning</u>. We have also raised the matter with our local MP, Matt Hancock.

We know Unity's plan is going to adversely affect many of you financially, practically and logistically.
