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#### **SUMMER TERM 1 ~ SCHOOL MEALS**

For pupils in Years 3 to 6 (Oak Class and Hawthorn Class) the cost of a school meal is £2.60 per day. This half-term will cost £78.00 in total, (a week of school meals is £13.00.) Children can alternate between packed lunches and school meals as preferred but school meals need to be paid for in advance. Here is the link:

This does not affect those of you whose child/ren have school meals through the government's universal free school meal' offer for children in Reception through to Year 2 or entitlement due to eliqibility for Pupil Premium.

#### **SWIMMING**

Our youngest children across both schools started their swimming sessions at our heated pool on Monday and did fantastically well.

Just a reminder the children will need:

- A ONE PIECE swimming costume or pair of swimming shorts / trunks
- a towel
- a swimming hat
- Suitable footwear to walk from the classroom to the pool, (e.g. flip flops / water shoes / crocs,)
   otherwise they will be wearing their school shoes.

#### DRIVING AND PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL SITE

I have received some very negative feedback from local residents regarding speeding, road use and inconsiderate parking on North Street and Church Street at the start and end of the school day.

Whilst I know everyone is aware of the challenges with regards our school site and parking, and I have frequently highlighted the concerns, including the worry that one of our children could be injured or worse in a road traffic accident, the difficulties are continuing.

Negatively affected residents will be making use of West Suffolk's 'on street parking infringement' regulations through which specific vehicles can be reported for offences such as speeding, blocking access, parking in front of dropped kerbs, obstructing junctions, stopping on school yellow lines, parking on grass verges and blocking pedestrian access.

I understand this involves reporting the issue at <u>Report Street Parking</u>
<u>Infringements</u> including the car registration number and a few other details, (photographic evidence is optional) and fines can be issued.

Additionally, it can also lead to Civil Enforcement Officers (CEOs) visiting our locality and issuing penalty charge notices (PCNs) to illegally parked vehicles.

With this in mind is vital due care and attention for our school, our neighbours and other drivers is given. Please leave a little earlier in the morning and use the parking available at the village hall or the pub and take the short walk to and from the school site.

#### FREE SCHOOL MEALS ~ ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

With the current economic climate and continuing rises in costs to living, we wanted to remind families about accessing free school meals.

We strongly urge you to check, especially if your circumstances have changed or change unexpectedly and remember they are not just available if you are unemployed. The process is completely confidential and pupils entitled to and claiming free school meals are not identified in any way.

You can be reassured your child has access to a healthy, nutritious and tasty meal at lunchtime and is well nourished for an afternoon of learning.

In addition, the number of pupils registered will positively impact on school funding; in these tricky financial times this will provide much needed extra financial support to the school so please check and register, whether or not your child wishes to eat a school meal regularly.

# Year 2 parents - are you ready for September?

Your child will no longer receive Universal Infant Free School Meals when they move to Year 3 unless you **apply now** and are eligible.

You will save over £435 a year and your child's school will receive extra funding to support your child with their learning.

If you have already applied and have been found to be eligible, you do not need to reapply.


To be eligible for Free School Meals you must receive one of the following:

- Universal Credit (up to £7,400 net earned income)
- · Income Support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- If you are supported under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit but no element of Working Tax Credit and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190.
- Working Tax Credit 4 week run on
