STAFFING UPDATE

SWITCH OFF WHEN PARKED!

Exhaust fumes from cars are linked to increases in asthma, allergies, heart and lung disease and even cancer. Children are especially vulnerable to the effects of air pollution. It can stunt lung growth, therefore having an impact on their health for the rest of their life.

Even though children only spend 40% of their day at school, research has shown that as much as 60% of a child's exposure to pollution can be from the school run and while at school

If you need to use a car for the school run, think about switching the engine off, don't have it idling. It's better for the climate and our children.

l need to run the engine to keep the heater on.	The heater should stay warm with just the ignition on for up to 30 minutes after parking.
If I'm parked on a yellow line, keeping my engine running means l won't get a fine.	Idling is against the traffic regulations so you could get a fine for idling and a parking ticket.
Doesn't stopping and starting wear out the engine?	This is no longer a problem with modern engines, and by not idling you will use less fuel and reduce your fuel costs.
But surely idling doesn't contribute very much to air pollution in the grand scheme of things?	Idling can create high pollution spikes which can affect the people who live work and go to school on that street.
