SPRING TERM 2 ~ SCHOOL MEALS

REPORTING ABSENCE / GENERAL ENQUIRIES / COMMUNICATION

Please note all absences, and changes to end of day collection arrangements, need to be communicated to the School Office in the first instance. The Administration Team, Mrs Price and Mrs Mitson, are responsible for attendance reporting and whilst we very much appreciate parents updating Class Teachers via Class Dojo, it is vital this information is shared directly with the School Office as soon as possible.

For learning related matters it is, of course, your child's Class Teacher you need to speak to and the easiest and quickest way for this is via our learning platform, Class Dojo or via email. Whilst our teaching team is incredibly conscientious and will endeavour to respond to any and all messages sent as soon, I am very aware colleagues are receiving messages during their weekends and sometimes very late at night.

Please can I politely request that messages are sent during working hours, that is **between 8am and 6pm (at the latest,) Monday to Friday** and not at weekends. If you need to contact the school urgently, please leave a message on the school answerphone and office staff will respond as soon as they are able. Your email system may have a 'send later' function, which means you can compose your message at your convenience but time it to be sent during working hours. With Class Dojo messages can be composed and left there until it is an appropriate time to send.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

At Hundon Community Primary School the governors and staff aim to provide the very best educational experiences and secure the highest educational standards for every pupil who comes here. We seek to ensure the National Curriculum is delivered to all children, regardless of social background, race, gender or differences in ability. All our pupils are entitled to the development of knowledge, understanding, skills and attitudes, without exception.

We do this in partnership and collaboration with yourselves and without your vital support the positive progress and significant achievement of our pupils, your children, would be much reduced.

In recent analysis of our attendance figures I am a little disappointed to report that **around 19% of the School's population, have less than 90% attendance** for the school year to date. Whilst 90% in a test is often a positive outcome where attendance is concerned this equates to **a half-day absence every week**. These pupils have **missed the learning opportunities and the skill development provided in at least two subjects every week** for the entire school year to date.

90% attendance is also equivalent to missing four whole weeks of lessons; a whole month, absent from school. If a child has **90% attendance over five years at school it is the equivalent of missing one half of a school year!** Having **80% attendance** over the same period would mean they have **missed an entire school year!**

Attendance and punctuality are central to ensuring all pupils can fulfil their potential – pupils need to attend school regularly to benefit from their education.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE CONTINUED...

Missing out on lessons leaves children vulnerable to falling behind. It is widely acknowledged that children with poor attendance achieve less in both primary and secondary school.

Please can you help us by remembering any **leaves of absence** must be taken in school closure periods unless there are **rare and strictly exceptional circumstances** and **support your child's learning and progress** by ensuring that **non-urgent appointments**, for example, dentist, optician, Doctor, are **arranged outside school hours**.

I will, of course, be writing to some parents individually regarding this concern in due course but wanted to highlight this important issue as a matter of urgency so that all parents are fully aware of the impact poor attendance can have on their child's education, throughout their school career.
