As you will be aware, we unfortunately remain without an active PTA for the school to fundraise and organise additional events. So the children do not miss out, staff have kindly agreed to give up their free time to facilitate a Christmas Disco. (Ticket costs will cover the outlay for the drinks, crisps, sweets and glow sticks.) Additionally, the costs of the Key Stage 2 children's Christmas Lunch and crackers will be covered from Federation Funds, as, unlike other settings, including our sister school, we do not have a PTA to fundraise and pay for such 'additional extras'.

The weather has turned colder so it is very important that our children have their warm coats and, dare I say it, there has been the mention of the 's' word and so a reminder about our severe weather planning.....

We recognise it is important that our school remains open so parents are able to work and our pupils can continue to learn. School closure will be considered should safe access become a concern and/or the provision afforded the children be compromised due to the number of staff able to attend school safely. URGENT: START OF THE SCHOOL DAY

It has been brought to our attention that we have a **number of children** being **dropped off outside the school** and **left unsupervised** first thing in the morning. <u>This is before the start of the school day</u>. Please note children **remain the responsibility of their parent/carer <u>until</u>** they are 'handed over' to their Class Teacher at **8.45am** when **the school day begins** and **not before**.

Children must not be left without a supervising adult. Parents/carers are responsible for anything that goes wrong in their absence. It is an offence to leave a child alone if it places them at risk.

As a school, we recognise and sympathise with the often-complex pressures faced by families in balancing work and childcare. It is why we offer childcare provision first thing in the mornings from 8am for the nominal cost of £2.00 per session within our Morning Sports Club run by qualified staff from Prestige Sports. We urge parents/carers to make use of this facility and book sessions to support childcare needs with Mrs Mitson in our School Office.

Additionally, we also recognise the challenges of parking around our school site so we politely ask parents to consider their child's safety and welfare ~ arrive a few minutes early, park a little further away and walk your child into school. Stay with them and set them up to have the best day!

SUPERVISION OF CHILDREN

We continue to be very concerned at further reports received regarding the behaviour of a small number of children, likely to be under 10, in and around the village, unsupervised.

We have received further worrying reports of <u>children with vapes</u> as well as behaving inappropriately at the park and village shop. This is in addition to the recently highlighted concerns about young girls and boys, cycling and scootering unsafely on the roads and pavements, putting themselves, pedestrians and drivers at risk.

We are compelled to share this with you; we are very concerned about this, not least the safety of these children as well as the possible trouble they could find themselves in with the police for anti-social behaviour or worse.

If you have a child born between **1st September 2019** and **31st August 2020** you must apply for a place by midnight on Monday **15th January 2024.**
