<u>School Meals ~ an update</u>

As you know, you can choose for your child/ren to have our school meals at lunchtime, be it through choice, the government's 'universal free school meal' offer for children in Reception through to Year 2 or entitlement due to eligibility for Pupil Premium Funding.

Unlike many primary schools nationally of our size, we are fortunate to have our own well-equipped, fully functioning kitchen where Jen, our Cook, from EATS catering, prepares our meals fresh, every day from scratch, accommodating dietary requirements and individual preferences as much as possible. Our menus and meals therein are handcrafted, regularly updated to take account of freshness and seasonality as well as source ingredients ethically.

In the last 12 months, food prices have risen tremendously. Our catering service have advised we will need to pay an additional £17,248 in the next financial year, beginning in April, to cover the shortfall between income from school meals and all costs associated with providing meals for our pupils within the Federation.

One suggestion to help reduce this shortfall is that we pass on this cost to parents, increasing the prices of meals from £2.30 (static since 2014) to £2.50. Given the present economic climate, we appreciate many of you are feeling financial pressures, therefore, the Federation's Governing Body has agreed the Federation will absorb the shortfall and maintain the cost of meals at £2.30 at the current time.
